In 1921, a group of Texas Masons approached W. B. Carrell, M.D., one of Dallas' first orthopedic surgeons, about caring for children with polio regardless of the family's ability to pay. Nearly 100 years later, Scottish Rite for Children remains a cornerstone of the Dallas community.

Scottish Rite specializes in the treatment of orthopedic conditions, sports injuries and fractures, as well as certain related arthritic and neurological disorders and learning disorders, such as dyslexia. As pioneers in the field, they continue to improve the lives of children through the provision of exceptional medical care and the pursuit and dissemination of innovative research.

In the fall of 2018, Scottish Rite for Children constructed its first satellite facility, increasing access to care for tens of thousands of children in the areas north of Dallas. The Scottish Rite for Children Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Center is located in Frisco at the corner of Lebanon Road and the Dallas North Tollway.

In 2021, Scottish Rite for Children will celebrate another incredible milestone: 100 years of giving children back their childhood!
